

ID: Cap grayish-buff w/ thin warts; convex. Stalk w/ bulb showing volval remains.

Habitat: Scattered, groups. On ground in mixed forests.

Cap: 1 - 2.2" [2.5 - 5.5 cm]

Grayish-buff (yellowing w/ age). Convex (flat in age). Smooth; dotted w/thin pallid warts. Margin becomes lined w/ age. Flesh white (stains slightly yellow).

Gills: White. Free. Crowded.

Spores: White. Nearly round or broadly ellipsoid.

Stalk: 1 – 2.8" [2.5 – 7 cm] x 0.35 – 0.44" [9 – 11 mm]

White. Woolly/flocculent. White ring may disappear. Bulb has some volval

remains.

Frequency: Fairly common.


Locations: DANPV, FRANF, HANVL, RKBRP, SLMLP, UMDCF.
