Carrot-foot Amanita

Carror-foot Amanita

ID: Cap pinkish-buff w/ thin warts; convex. Stalk w/ large spindle-shaped pinkish-orange bulb showing volval remains.

Habitat: Solitary, scattered, groups. On ground in mixed conifer and deciduous forests.

Cap: 2.4 – 11.8" [6 – 29.5 cm]

Pale cream/pale pinkish-orange; conical warts same color. Convex (flat in age; may have broad umbo). Dry/shiny. Margin may have remains of partial veil. Flesh white, thick w/ strange, unpleasant odor like old ham.

Gills: White/cream. Free. Crowded.

Spores: White. Elliptic, smooth.

Stalk: 3.1 – 8.2" [8 – 21 cm] x 0.4 – 1.1" [1 – 3 cm]

Whitish/pale pinkish-orange. Dry. Floccose. Collapsed large membranous superior white ring. Large spindle-shaped bulb may bear conical warts; may split longitudinally.

Frequency: Fairly common.

Locations: FRANF, HIRIP, MCHPV, PIGTL, RKBRP, SAVPK.

Notes: Do not taste! Mycobank 539487. Pigtail (8/13/2015) and Morning Choice Trail (7/29/2014) specimens identified by examination of spores by R. Solem. Patterned veil over gills may remain for some time.
