ID: Cap white w/ gray-tan powdery coating; hemispheric to broadly conic w/ hanging veil fragments. Stalk may be dog-legged. No distinct odor.

Habitat: Solitary; scattered; mixed woods (oak-pine but sometimes beech-hickory).

Cap: 1 – 3" [2.5 – 8 cm]

White w/ pale grayish-/brown-buff fine powder or floccose warts. Hemispheric w/ incurved margin (broadly convex in age); rim w/ hanging fibrous/cottony veil fragments. Dry. Flesh white. Odor not distinctive.

Gills: Whitish; edges powdery. Barely notched. Close. Partial gills.


Spores: White. Ellipsoid, smooth, hyaline.

Stalk: 2 – 5.5" x 0.2 – 0.8" [5 – 14 cm x 6 – 20 mm]

White. Powdery/scurfy. Tapers up; partially rooting. May be somewhat dog-legged or curved. Volva may be flattened, either gradually elongate or abruptly tapered to root.

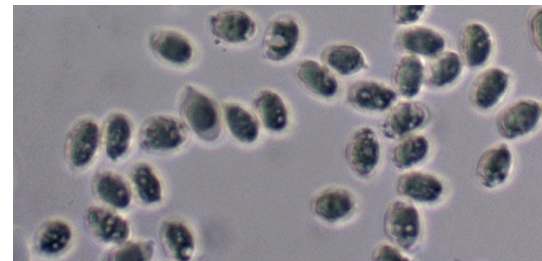
Frequency: Uncommon.

Locations: GONRA.
