ID: Cap creamy w/ some warts; stalk white w/ sheath-like volva.

Habitat: Solitary, loosely grouped. On ground in mixed forests.

Cap: 3 - 7.5" [7.5 - 19 cm]

Creamy/whitish-yellowish, darker disc. Convex (flatter w/ lined margin in age). Smooth (sticky when wet). Some whitish cottony warts.

Gills: White. Free. Crowded.

Spores: White.

Stalk: 3.1 - 4.7" x 1/4 - 1/2" [8 - 20 cm x 8 - 20 mm]

White. Smooth (or finely hairy near top), strongly hairy/scaly near base. Ring collapses and droops. Basal bulb has membranous woolly rings near base (usually) and sheath-like volva.

Frequency: Occasional.

Locations: BRNBR, MCHPV, PIGTL, ROBNC, WSTRP.

Notes: Do not taste! Mycobank 156565. Big Branch specimen verified by examination of spores by R. Solem.
