
Amanita volvata complex (Peck) Lloyd

Amanita volvata

Amanltaceae



Habitat: Solitary, scattered, groups. On ground in hardwood or mixed forests.

Cap: 1.4– 2.4" [3.5 – 6 cm]

Volvate Amanita

Whitish or w/ brownish disc. Dry. White/creamy white thin floccose patches. Convex (nearly flat in age). Margin may be faintly striate. Flesh white, thick.

Gills: White. Free. Crowded.

Spores: White. Broadly ellipsoid, smooth.

Stalk: 1.8 - 2.8" x 1/4 - 1/2" [4.5 - 7 cm x 5 - 12 mm] White. Dry. Minutely floccose-scaly. Slight taper upward. Ring absent. Volva (1 - 1.5 " [2.5 - 3.8 cm]) white, dry, solid, saccate, membranous, minutely floccose-scaly, almost entirely buried. Solid.

Frequency: Occasional.

Locations: MPENA, SLMLP, WSTRP.

Notes: Do not taste! Mycobank 173945. Schooley Mill Park specimen identified by examination of spores by R. Solem.
