**ID**: Cap dark red/pink (yellow and finely cracked in age); convex (flat/irregular in age); flesh yellow, stains blue. Pores yellow (dingy in age), usually stain greenish-blue. Stalk club-shaped; yellow at top, remainder rosy-red. Use FeSO<sub>4</sub> and KOH.

Habitat: Solitary, groups. In hardwood (oak) or mixed forests.

**Cap**: 2 - 6" [5 - 15.5 cm]

Dark red or other shades of red/pink (turns yellow in age). Dry. Velvety when young (finely cracked in age). Convex (flat/irregular in age). Flesh pale yellow, slowly/quickly staining blue.

**Pores**: Yellow (dingy yellow/olive in age). Stains greenish-blue (sometimes). Free to attached. Angular. (1 - 2/mm). Tubes (3 - 10 mm).

Spores: Olive/gray-brown.

**Stalk**: 2 – 4" x 0.4 – 1.1" [5 – 10 cm x 1 – 3 cm]

Yellow at top, red/rosy red for remainder. Cylindrical/club-shaped. Flesh vellow, quickly stains blue (or not). Solid.

**Frequency**: Very common.

**Locations**: BIGBR, DANPV, HENPV, HIRIP, MCHPV, MPENA, NOLAP, PIGTL, RKBRP, SAVPK, SLMLP, SYRIV, TRIRS, TUFTS, WSTRP, WINTR.

**Notes**: Stalk on variety *subreticulatus* has reticulation; var. *bicolor* does not. Cap stains black w/ FeSO4. Flesh stains blue-gray/olive-green w/ FeSO<sub>4</sub> and pale yellow w/ KOH.

Synonym: Boletus bicolor.
