ID: Pinkish-salmon, hygrophanous, stalk same color or lighter.

Habitat: Scattered, groups. On soil or decaying wood in mixed woods or under rhododendron.

Cap: 0.1 - 1.2" [0.3 - 3 cm]

Pinkish-cinnamon/pinkish-brown, fades to clay-brown/pinkish-buff, darker in age). Convex (flat and pleated in age). Glabrous, hygrophanous. Flesh waxy, thin in center, white or color of cap. Odd odor.

Gills: Brown or color of cap. Attached/decurrent. Distant. Edges even.

Spores: White.

Stalk: 0.8 - 3.1" x 1/12 - 1/4" [2 - 8 cm x 2 - 7 mm]

Color of cap (darker in age to black). White bloom above, smooth below.

Equal or tapers down.

Frequency: Uncommon.
