ID: Cap reddish brown. Stalk has one or more cinnabar rings and a bulbous base. Use KOH.

Habitat: Solitary, groups. On ground or in mosses exclusively in birch (Betulina).

Cap: 2 - 4.8" [5 - 12 cm]

Reddish-brown/brownish-orange. Bell-shaped (broadly convex/nearly flat w/ broad umbo. Moist or dry; covered w/ tiny fibrils but nearly smooth. Margin incurved (expanded in age), sometimes w/ veil remnants.

Gills: Tawny (rusty brown in age). Attached; distant; broad.

Spores: *Rusty-brown*. Oval/almond-shaped, finely warted, brown.

Stalk: 2.8 – 5.9" x 0.4 – 1" [7 – 15 cm x 1 – 1.5 cm]

Whitish/pale brown w/ one or more cinnabar-red rings/zones. Tapers up but has club-shaped/bulbous base. Base w white mycelium.

Frequency: Uncommon.

Locations: BIGBR.

Notes: Mycobank 214757. KOH stains cap vlack and orange areas of stalk purple. Big Branch (10/10/2015) specimen identified by examination of spores by R. Solem.
