ID: Disc red-brown (wet) or yellow-brown (dry). Stalk club-shaped. Strong odor (spicy or plant-like).

Habitat: Scattered. On ground in moss in mixed forests or hemlocks.

Cap: 1.6 – 2.8" [4 – 7 cm]

Disc dark red-brown when wet, drying to yellow-brown. Smooth, slightly shiny. Conical/bell-shaped. Margin covered w/ fine white veil fragments. Flesh pallid w/ red-brown patches, fragile. Odor strong, plant-like or spicy.

Gills: Coffee/pale cinnamon (darker cocoa-brown in age). Notched.

Spores: Rusty-brown. Ellipsoid, warty.

Stalk: 1.6 – 3.5" x 1/4 – 1/2" [4 – 9 cm x 7 – 15 mm]
White w/ matted hairs. Striated. Club-shaped. Stuffed.

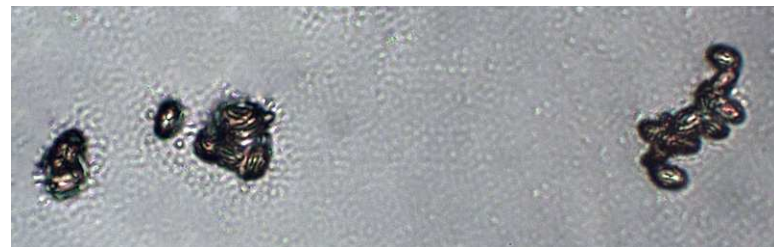
Frequency: Uncommon.
