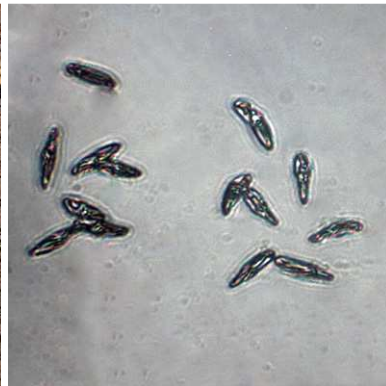

ID: Tiny white “pins” on decaying wood.

Habitat: Scattered, groups. On decaying wood (oak).

Fruiting Body: 1/32 – 1/16” [1 – 3 mm]
White (brownish in age). Smooth. Convex. Margin inrolled.

Stalk: 1/8 – 1/4” [5 - 10 mm]. White. Equal.

Spores: *Hyaline*. Fusiform/one side flatter, hyaline.

Frequency: Occasional.

Locations: CEDLP, MCHPV. SYRIV.

Notes: Mycobank 220435. Morning Choice, PVSP, and Sykesville/River Road, PVSP, records identified by examination of spores by R. Solem.
