ID: On ground in forests. Cap orange-yellow, fades in age, smooth, moist; bell-shaped, pointed umbo; convex in age. Stalk yellow w/ white mycelium.

Habitat: Scattered, groups. On ground in forests.

Cap: 0.4 - 1.2" [1 - 3 cm]

Yellow/orangish-yellow (fades in age). Moist. Smooth. Bell-shaped/convex (more convex in age), small pointed umbo. Margin splits in age. Flesh yellowish.

Gills: Yellow (pinkish tinged in age). Narrowly attached/notched. Subdistant. Broad.

Spores: *Salmon-pink*. Angled, 4-sided, straw color.

Stalk: 2 – 4" x 1/16 – 1/4" [5 – 10 cm x 2 – 5 mm]

Yellow. Dry. Hollow. White mycelium.

Frequency: Fairly common.

Locations: BOLPL, BRNBR, GONRA, LONGC, MANWD, PIGTL, RKBRP, ROBNC, ROGOR, SAVPK, WINTR.

Notes: Mycobank 158631. Pigtail and Gorman Stream Valley NRA specimens identified by examination of spores by R. Solem. Gorman Stream Valley NRA fruiting body was white.
