ID: Cap pale brown to gray w/ scales/patches; short thick lateral stalk.

Habitat: Solitary, scattered, groups. On standing dead/dying birch.

Cap: 1.1 - 10" [3 - 25.5 cm]

Pale brown w/ brown to gray streaks. Smooth (breaking into scales/patches in age). Margin inrolled (especially in age). Flesh white, fibrous-tough

(0.4 - 2" [1 - 5 cm].

Pores: White/smooth (pale-/yellowish-brown in age). Circular/angular, torn w/ age (3 - 5/mm). Tubes (2 - 10 mm).

Stalk: Absent/very short.

Spores: White.

Frequency: Uncommon.

Locations: GWACP, PIGTL.

Notes: Mycobank 100963. Obligate on various species of birch (*Betula*).

Synonym: Piptoporus betulinus
