**ID**: Body brownish-red, sticky when young, looks lacquered when old; shelf-like/irregular, concentrically zoned, margin yellowish/ white. Pores white/cream (ochre in age). Stalk short, stout.

Habitat: Solitary, groups. On decaying hardwoods (especially oak).

**Fruiting Body**: 2-11.8" x up to 1.1" thick [5-30 cm x 3 cm] Brownish-red in age, yellowish/whitish near margin. Lacquered surface (sticky when young), concentrically zoned, shallowly furrowed. Semicircular/shelf-like. Flesh whitish (soft and corky), (brown in age and fibrous-tough).

**Pores**: White/cream (ochre in age). Bruise brown when fresh. Circular (2 - 3/mm). Tubes (5 - 20 mm).

**Stalk**: 1.1 x 1.5" [3 cm x 4 cm]

Sessile or short/rudimentary, brownish-red/mahogany/blackish-brown, shiny, lacquered surface.

Spores: Brown.

Frequency: Occasional.

Locations: JACPD, OTHER.

**Notes**: Mycobank 123196. *Ganoderma tsugae* grows on rotting coniferous wood. Previously misidentified as *G. lucidum.. Also see G. curtisii*.
