ID: Body whitish (yellowish in age); shaggy “beard” w/ long spines.

Habitat: Solitary. On living tree trunks or fallen hardwood logs (especially oak).

Fruiting Body: 2.8 – 8” x 3.8 – 8” [9.5 – 20 cm x 7 – 20.5 cm]. Whitish/yellowish (brownish in age). Flesh, thick, white, soft. Cushion-shaped or globular, branchless, giving rise to long spines (2 – 7 cm), each tapering to a point.

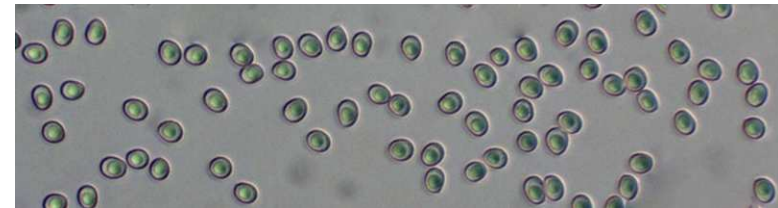
Spores: *White.* Ellipsoid, smooth, hyaline.

Frequency: Common.

Locations: GONRA, HENPV, LONGC, MARPV, MCHPV, MPENA, MURHL, NOLAP, OTHER, RKBPR, ROBNC, SAVPK, SLMLP, WSTRP, WINTR.

Notes: Mycobank 356812. Murray Hill specimen identified by examination of spores by R. Solem.
