**ID**: Cap variable (dull brick red/brown-orange); zoned w/ darker bands.Copious white latex. Cinnamon-buff gills.

Habitat: Solitary, scattered, groups. On ground in oak forests.

**Cap**: 2 - 6" [5 - 15.5 cm]

Variable (typically dull brick-/brownish red; red-/brown-orange, margin often paler); zoned w/ darker bands (often fading in age). Dry. Velvety (young); scurfy/nearly glabrous (in age). Latex white, copious, acrid; not staining.

**Gills**: Cinnamon/buff (pinkish-cinnamon, darkening in age). Decurrent. Close. Narrow. Stain rusty-/reddish-brown.

Spores: White.

**Stalk**: 0.8 - 2.4" x 0.4 - 1" [2 - 6 cm x 1 - 2.5 cm]

Whitish bloom (young); spotted reddish-brown/dull orange (in age). Nearly

equal. Solid (hollow in age).

Frequency: Uncommon.

Locations: MPENA.

Notes: Mycobank 164773. Very dark gills.
