**ID**: Cap color shdes of brown (darkens in age); smooth/fibrillose. Pores white (dull white in age). Stalk whitish w/ brown/black scabers; base of stalk may stain bluish. Under birch and other hardwoods.

**Habitat**: Scattered, groups. On ground under birch, oak, and other hardwoods.

## **Cap**: 0.8 – 3.1" [2 – 8 cm]

Brown; sometimes whitish (darkens in age). Dry. Smooth to fibrillose, often cracked in age. Convex (broadly convex in age). Flesh white (unchanging or slowly staining pinkish/reddish when exposed.

**Pores**: Grayish-white (ochraecous in age). Depressed near stalk. Circular (2 - 4/mm). Tubes (8 - 16 mm).

Spores: Dull-brown. Fusiform, smooth, light brown.

**Stalk**: 2.4 - 4" x 5/16 - 5/8" [6 - 10 cm x 8 - 13 mm] Whitish/pale tan. Dry w/ brownish/ blackish scabers. Flesh unchanging or like cap flesh, base may stain bluish. Tapers up. Solid.

## Frequency: Occasional.

Locations: BIGBR, OTHER, SLMLP, TRIRS.

**Notes:** Mycobank 100712. All records identified by examination of spores by R. Solem. Donleigh specimen verified by A. Bessette (*pers. comm.*)

Synonym: Leccinum oxydabile.
