Hairy Panus Ruddy Panus

Lentinus strigosus Polyporaceae

ID: Densely hairy, pinkish cap; fan-shaped. Bitter taste.

Habitat: Solitary, clusters. On hardwoods.

Cap: 1 – 3" [2.5 – 7.5 cm]

Pinkish-tan/reddish-brown (purple tints when young, paler in age). Densely hairy, velvety/fuzzy. Fan-/funnel-shaped, sometimes lobed. Margin inrolled and hairy. Flesh white, thin, tough. Taste bitter.

Gills: White to tan. Close, narrow.

Spores: White/off-white toward cream. Elliptical, smooth.

Stalk: Pinkish-tan/light reddish-brown. Short, stubby, mostly lateral, hairy.

Frequency: Occasional.

Locations: MPENA, MTPLT, OTHER, WINTR.

Synonyms: Lentinellus strigosus. Panus rudis.
