
Strophariaceae



ID: Orange-brown cap; scaly stem; upturned ring.

Habitact: Single, scattered, groups. Debris/buried wood in mixed forests.

Cap: 1.1 - 3.1" [3 - 8 cm]

Orange/brick-red, often paler (in age). Viscid when fresh. Covered w/whitish, scattered, pointed scales (many fewer in age). Convex (broadly convex in age). Margin w/ veil remnants. Flesh white.

Gills: Grayish, then violet-gray (purple-brown in age); edges whitish. Attached.

Spores: Purple-brown.

Stalk: 2.4 - 4.8° x 1/4 - 3/8° [6 - 12 cm x 6 - 10 mm]

Ochre. Densely covered from ring to base w/ whitish scales; above ring,

whitish pruinose. Ring whitish, membranous, flaring.

Frequency: Uncommon.

Locations: RKBRP.
