Pink Mycena

Mycena pura Mycenaceae

ID: Variable color (pink/purple/red/lilac). Convex/flat. Smooth. Odor/taste of radishes. Gills broad w/ whitish edges.

Habitat: Solitary, scattered, groups. On ground in hardwood or coniferous woods.

Cap: 0.8 – 3" [2 – 7.5 cm]

Color quite variable (pink, purple, red, lilac). Convex/flat. Smooth. Moist. Odor/taste of radishes.

Gills: Whitish/bluish/purplish w/ whitish edges. Close. Very broad. Secondary gills.

Spores: White.

Stalk: 1 - 4" x 1/16 - 1/4" [6 - 10 cm x 1.5 - 6 mm] Color of cap or paler. Flattened/twisted. Base somewhat enlarged. Hollow.

Frequency: Occasional.

Locations: HENPV, HIRIP, PIGTL, SYRIV.
