ID: Body bright red/brownish-red; round; lighter where attached; asexual stage light orange/pink.

Habitat: Scattered, dense clusters. On decaying hardwoods.

Fruiting Body: 1/8 – 1/4" [3 – 6 mm]

Bright red/brownish-red (darker in age). Round, minutely warted. As exual (condidial) stage cushion-like light orange-/pink/bright red (1.5 - 4 mm).

Spores: *Hyaline*. Ellipsoid, smooth, hyaline, often curved; single septum. $12 - 19 \times 5 - 7 \mu m$.

Frequency: Uncommon.

Locations: WSTRP.
