

## Hairy Panus Ruddy Panus

Panus neostrigosus
Polyporaceae

**ID**: Densely hairy, pinkish cap; fan-shaped. Bitter taste.

**Habitat**: Solitary, clusters. On hardwoods.

**Cap**: 1 - 3" [2.5 - 7.5 cm]

Pinkish-tan/reddish-brown (purple tints when young, paler in age). Densely hairy, velvety/fuzzy. Fan-/funnel-shaped, sometimes lobed. Margin inrolled and hairy. Flesh white, thin, tough. Taste bitter.

Gills: White to tan. Close, narrow.

Spores: White/off-white toward cream. Ellipsoid, smooth.

**Stalk**: Pinkish-tan/light reddish-brown. Short, stubby, mostly lateral, hairy.

Frequency: Fairly common.

Locations: GUILP, HAMVL, MPENA, MTPLT, OTHER, SLMLP, WINTR.

**Notes:** Mycobank 801445. MPENA specimen identified by examination of spores by R. Solem.

Synonyms: Lentinus strigosus. P. rudis.
