ID: Body reddish/orangish; cylindric, pock-marked w/ slimy greenish-brown cap. Foul smelling. Body egg-like before emergence.

Habitat: Solitary, groups. On ground in hardwoods or mixed woods.

Fertile surface (head): 1.4 – 2” x 2 – 2.8” high [3.5 – 5 cm x 5 – 7 cm]
 Oval to bell-shaped w/ skirt, covered by spore mass; deeply pitted w/ white-rimmed opening at apex. White.

Stalk: 2 – 7” x 0.6” [5 – 17 cm x 1.5 cm]
 White w/ pinkish/pinkish-red tints. Roughened. Hollow, spongy. Nearly equal. Surrounded by white, net-like, flaring veil (indusium) emerging from just beneath the head. Volva whitish/pale flesh-color/pinkish-brown; wrinkled/folded, tough.

Immature Fruiting Body: Egg-like or round. Whitish/pale brown; when sliced, shows stinkhorn forming, surrounded by gelatinous substance.

Spore Mass: Slimy, foul smelling: *Greenish-brown/olive-brown*. Ellipsoid, smooth, hyaline.

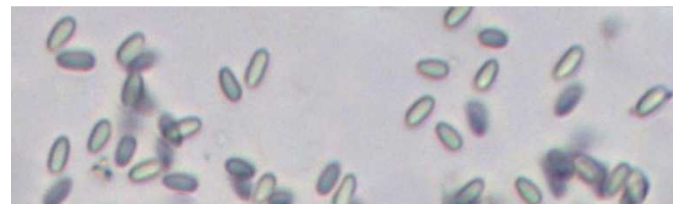
Frequency: Uncommon.
