

Bladder Stalks

Physalacria inflata Physalacriaceae

ID: Whitish, bladder-like (or collapsed) head on short stalks.

Habitat: Clustered. On debarked hardwoods, rotted wood, dead leaves.

Cap: 1/32 - 3/8" [1 – 10 mm] round or deflated

Rounded/deflated bladderlike head, often wavy/folded. Whitish/cream/ yelllowish. Hollow, wavy-firm.

Stalk: 1/8 - 3/4" [3 – 20 mm] Very thin, firm, may be hairy.

Spores: White. Ellipsoid, smooth, hyaline.

Frequency: Uncommon.

Locations: WINTR.
