ID: Cap white/brown; pendant; persists. Very small.

Habitat: Groups. Bark of dead hardwoods (oak, hickory, walnut).

Cap: 1/32 - 1/4" [1 – 5 mm]

White/brown; leathery/rigid; pendant, semicircular. Persists in age.

Stalk: 1/8 – 1/4" " x [3 – 5 mm]

Whitish; powdery; mealy. Attached at top, extends into cap.

Pores: Whitish/brownish. Circular (6+/mm). Tubes (0.2 – 0.5 mm)

Spores: White.

Frequency: Uncommon.

Locations: PIGTL, ROBNC, SLMLP.

Note: Mycobank 431969. Nominal growing season is August – October,

but specimens were photographed in spring .
