**ID**: Brown/black; convex; margin w/ dark zone. Gills brown/black, mottled; edges whitish. Stalk coated w/ white fibrils.

Habitat: Scattered, groups. On horse and cow dung.

**Cap**: 1.2 - 2" [3 - 5 cm]

Cinnamon-brown (moist)/blackish (wet)/tan(dry). Hygrophanous. Smooth/wrinkled. Convex/bell-shaped. Broad dark zone aroung margin. Flesh brownish.

Gills: Mottled dingy brown/black; edges whitish. Attached. Close.

Spores: Jet black.

**Stalk**: 1.6 - 4" x 1/8 - 1/4" [4 - 10 cm x 3 - 5 mm]

Reddish-brown/whitish Coated w/ tiny white fibrils. Equal (or both ends slight

taper). Hollow.

Frequency: Uncommon.

Locations: LONGC.
