

ID: White/pale buff (becomes brown/grey); viscid when wet; margin inrolled. Use KOH.

Habitat: Solitary, scattered. In conifer forests.

Cap: 2 – 6" [5 – 15 cm]

White/pale buff (dark in age). Flattened (depressed in age). Viscid when wet. Margin inrolled. Skin peels. Flesh white; slowly turns pink when bruised, then grey. Taste mild.

Gills: White/cream. Close; subdecurrent.

Spores: *White*. Nearly round; irregular crests & ridges, flattened spines, conical warts; prominences 1.2 µm.

Stalk: 0.8 - 2.4" x 0.4 - 0.8" [4 - 12 cm x 20 - 40 mm] White, bruising reddish-brown. Flesh white; pinkish when cut, then brownish/grey.

Frequency: Uncommon..

Locations: GUIIPK, HANVL.

Notes: Mycobank 168636. Guilford Park specimen verified by examination of spores by R. Solem. KOH turns cap orange.
