ID: Cap white/cream, sticky when wet; broadly convex (shallowly depressed in age). Stalk white. Almond odor. Taste not distinctive or becomes acrid.

Habitat: Solitary, scattered, groups. On ground in mixed forests.

Cap: 1.5 – 4" [2.5 – 10 cm]

Tawny to yellowish-brown (ivory when young). Smooth; viscid when wet. Convex (broadly convex in age). Cuticle peels 3/4 to center. Margin deeply and widely striate. Flesh white, brittle. Almond odor (foetid odor in age). Taste not distinctive or becomes acrid.

Gills: Grayish-cream/yellowish-white. Attached. Crowded; some forked near stalk.

Spores: Pale yellow.

Stalk: 1 - 4" x 0.4 - 1.1" [2.5 - 10 cm x 1 - 3 cm] White/yellowish-white. Dry. Smooth. Equal. Stuffed (hollow in age).

Frequency: Occasional.

Locations: LONGC. MPENA. RKBRP. WINTR.

Notes: Mycobank 344673. ID was by macro characteristics, not by microscopic examination of spores.
