ID: Cap green/blue-green, quilt-like patches; convex.

Habitat: Solitary, scattered, groups. On ground in hardwood forests (& probably conifers).

Cap: 3 – 4.5" [7.5 – 11.5 cm]

Green/blue-green. Dry; velvety w/ large crustose patches (≥ 8 mm). Round/convex (broadly convex w/ depressed center in age). Margin striate. Flesh white, brittle.

Gills: Creamy. Attached (nearly free in age). Close.

Spores: *White*. Ellipsoid, warts $>$ up to 0.5 μ m high.

Stalk: 1.2 – 2.5" x 0.3 – 1.5" [3 – 6.5 cm x 0.8 – 4 cm]
White (discolors in age). Dry. Smooth. Equal.

Frequency: Uncommon

Locations: OTHER.

Notes: Micobank 501363. E&S 238. Kuo: "*Russula parvovirescens* ... differs from the classic concept or *Russula virescens* in its blue-green colors, larger crustose patches, lined cap margin, generally smaller stature, and in its pileipellis." Samantha Way specimen identified by examination of spores (provided by R. Orr) by R. Solem.
