ID: Cap red/rose; flesh brittle; stalk white, tinged pink. Use KOH.

Habitat: Solitary, scattered. In pine forests.

Cap: 1 – 4" [2.5 – 10 cm]

Blood-/cherry-red to rose; may have pale pink/white streaks, viscid. Convex (flattened/depressed in age). Flesh white, spongy, brittle. Taste acrid.

Gills: Cream. Slightly decurrent. Close. Forked near stalk.

Spores: Medium yellow. Ellipsoid w/ isolated pointed warts.

Stalk: 2 - 4" x 0.2 - 0.8" [5 - 10 cm x 1 - 3 cm] White, tinged pink/red (often w/ yellow stains). Smooth. Flesh spongy, often stuffed/hollow.


Frequency: Uncommon.
