ID: Cup white/brown concentrically zoned; persists. Cup zoned w/ gray-white/yellow-pale brown.

Habitat: Groups. Decaying hardwood.

Cup: 0.4 – 2" x [1 – 5 cm]

Zones w/ contrasting colors (white/grayish-white, yellowish/pale brown). Smooth/slightly velvety. Fan-/kidney-shaped, stiff. Margin thin, wavy. Flesh white (1 mm), fibrous-tough. Attached to sterile base.

Sterile base: Up to 0.6" [1.6 cm]

Brown (white and brown in age). Smooth. Concentrically zoned (blotched). Base persists in age (white) and remains on branch after cup disintegrates.

Pores: White/yellowish. Angular (2 – 4/mm).

Spores: White.

Frequency: Fairly common.

Locations: CASCT, GONRA, MPENA, MCHPV, OTHER, RKBRP, SAVMT.

Notes: Mycobank 261599. Gorman Stream Valley specimen identified by examination of spores by R. Solem.
