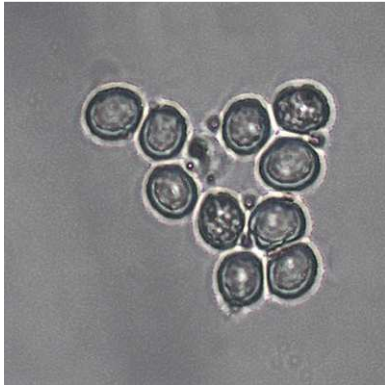

ID: Cap dark gray, covered w/ fibrils; face or edge of gills dark gray.

Habitat: Scattered, groups, in hardwood forests (beech/oak).

Cap: 1.8 – 6.9" [4.5 – 15 cm]

Dark gray; lighter between fibrils and near margin. Convex (broadly convex to mainly flat in age). Densely fibrillose. Margin smooth/slightly scaly. Flesh grayish- white. Taste bitter.

Gills: Whitish/pinkish gray/grayish-buff. Narrowly attached. Close. Secondary gills. Portions of gills and gill edges may be gray.

Spores: *White.* Broadly elipsoid, smooth.

Stalk: 1.2 – 3.1" x 0.4 – 1" [3 – 8 cm x 1 – 2.5 cm]

Whitish (yellowish tints in age). Flesh white. Smooth/slightly silky. Nearly Equal.

Frequency: Uncommon.

Locations: BOLPL.

Notes: Mycobank 126241. Bollman Place specimen identified by examination of spores by R. Solem.
