ID: Maroon cap, white pores, stalk color of cap.

Habitat: Solitary, groups. On ground under hardwoods (especially oaks).

Cap: 1.8 - 3.5" [4.5 - 9 cm]

Maroon to pinkish/dull reddish-brown. Convex (broadly convex/flat in age). Velvety (smoother in age). Dry. Flesh white

Pores: White (dingy white/brownish in age; bruises brown. Pores 1-3/mm.

Spores: *Pinkish/deep flesh color*. Narrowly oval, smooth.

Stalk: 2.5 – 3.5" x 0.6 – 1.1" [5 – 9 cm x 1.5 – 2.8 cm] Color of cap w/ white apex. Surface smooth, glabrous or w/ reticulation near apex. Equal or w/ mid-portion/base swollen. Solid.

Frequency: Uncommon.

Locations: WILLK.
