Phe illuctiction in Robbins is not Identical to the markinga as they wera obserfodo The top of the head, winge, back, and tail ware a plain dark brown and the whole bird appeared rethes sied and larger than the cowbirda with whom it closaly associatad. The ficice pathern appeaxed broken with some yellow brown above and below the eye with the suggegtion of darker line through tine eye. The ohin, throat, and upper breast vera a bright yellow orange with a broken thin dark line on each alde of the throat giving the suggestion of a collar, The lower portion of the breast was white with vertical brown stripes shading into a solid brown belly. It acretched for food on the ground and aeamed rather aggressive. When it flew there was no white in the wing so
