Large MALE: Head: black. Face: dark brown w/ gray-green upper surface of frons. Eyes: dark green, light bar between eyes. Thorax: dark brown w/ gray-green stripes. Abdomen: elongate, black, dorsal S2-6 tiny yellow arrowheads toward front, S7-8 elongated yellow points, S9 yellow mark; lateral S1-3 yellow marks, S4-7 tiny yellow marks, S8-9 larger marks; clubbed w/ S7 longest, S8 shortest (w/ rim); ventral S8-9 rusty color; large genitalia on S2. Legs: black, paler near body. Wings: slightly flavescent basal. Stigmas: brown. Appendages: blackish.

- FEMALE: Head: pair of large horns on occiput. Abdomen: less clubbed.
- Habitat: In grasses and willows along banks of rivers or high in treetops. Sand-bottomed areas of medium to fast streams. Fly late in day (4-5 PM; DCz); likes 90° weather.
- Reproduction: Patroling: swift and straight over water. Female oviposits into riffles of small brook. [DCz found breeding adult S. plagiatus/spiniceps in dappled sun, riffles w/ overhanging trees.] Exuviae in stream on rock sides or logs in water. Notes: Was Gomphus spiniceps. Exuviae are easier to find than adults.
- Similar Species: S. spiniceps is predominant in the Piedmont; S. laurae (Laura's C.) in the fall zone; and S. plagiatus (Russet-tipped C.; not in Howard County) in the Coastal Plain.
