Habitat: Almost anything w/ water. Still or slow-moving weedy water. Often seen perched on tips of stems or twigs, sun or shade w/ lowered wings. May defend a feeding perch.

Reproduction: Male patrols shoreline territory. Mating begins in air and continues after pair lands. Female oviposits by flying close to surface and dipping abdomen in water while male guards, occasionally alone. Larvae are underwater climbers; need >26 days to develop. Exuviae in trash near shore or up to 6' up bank. Two generations/year (bivoltine).
