MALE: Head/face: purple w/ large purple postocular spots sometimes connected by a narrow purple band. Thorax: purple w/ black middorsal/shoulder stripes black. Abdomen: purple-violet alternating w/ narrow, black rings; S7 black, S8-10 powdery purple-blue on top. Wings: clear. Stigmas: brown.

FEMALE: Dark brown, shades of brown, or dull purple. Chunkier than male. Abdomen: S8-10 pale.

Habitat: Most abundant along streams. Edges of lakes, ponds/bogs. Rocky lotic waters/small lakes. Adults prefer sunny spots on or near ground for resting horizontally (distinctive of this genus). Wary/quick to fly when approached.

Reproduction: Patrolling territory 6' long. Mate for 20-40 minutes. Female oviposits in tandem for 45-90 minutes on horizontal aquatic vegetation or in wet wood. Can breed in still waters as well as rivers/streams.
