Herbaceous plants, Field Horsetail, Early Saxifrage, Spring Beauty, Gill-over-the-ground, Wild Geranium, Rue Anemone, Wild Ginger, Skunk Cabbage, Yellow Violet, Kidney-leaved Buttercup, Lesser Celandine, Cut-leaved Toothwort, Slender Toothwort, Trout Lily, Star Chickweed, Common Blue violet, Jack-in-the-pulpit, Sweet White Violet, speedwell, Day Lilies, Mayapple, Bluets, Bedstraw, Cleavers, Miterwort, Dutchman's Breeches, Showy Orchis, Bloodroot. Not all were flowering. Field Horsetail had fertile and infertile stalks. Butterflies, Spring Azure, Cabbage White, Falcate Orangetip, Eastern Tiger Swallowtail. Amphibians, American Toad, tree frog.
