## Comments:

Connecticut Warbler had a complete eye ring, grayish throat, yellow under tail, light yellow on belly, no wing bars, entire back and wings brownish green, and large size compared to a nearby Common Yellowthroat. A probable SECOND Connecticut Warbler was seen the same afternoon which had different field marks.
