Details: Ideal weather for a field trip. Rains earlier in the week produced fungi to examine.

- Bleeding Mycena (*Mycena haematopsus*)
- Hairy Panus (*Lentinellus* [*Panus*] *strigosus*)
- Bitter Oyster (*Panellus* [*Panus*] *stipticus*)
- Honey Mushroom (*Armillaria mellea*)
- *Marasmius capillarus*
- *Lepiota cristata*
- Japanese Parasol (*Parasola* [*Coprinus*] *plicatis*)
- Changeable Pholiota (*Kuehneromyces* [*Pholiota*] *mutabilis*)
- *Pholiota* ssp (possibly *P. squarrosoides*)
- *Clitocybe* ssp.
- Broadgill (*Megacollybia rodmanii* [*platyphylla*])
- Clustered Bonnet (*Mycena epidendrum*)
- Shaggy Mane (*Coprinus comatus*)
- Oyster Mushroom (*Pleurotus ostreatus*)
- Mower's Mushroom (*Paneolina foenicisii*)
- Clustered Brittlestem (*Psathrella multipedata*)
- Small Chanterelle (*Cantharellus minor*)
- Cinnabar Chanterelle (*Cantharellus cinnabarinus*)

- Violet Toothed Polypore (*Trichaptum biforme*)
- Tender Nesting Polypore (*Hapalopilus nidulans*)
- False Turkey-tail (*Stereum ostrea*)
