Details: The last Centennial March walk began at a brisk 32 degrees, with a moderate breeze to add to the chill. The skies were mostly cloudy, with a low deck of clouds, permitting rare glimpses of sunshine. Among the highlights were a Gray Catbird seen by all, and a Brown Thrasher seen by only two. A pair of American Pipits at the dam was seen by many, but not the leader and a handful who had gotten well ahead of the group. All were able to enjoy a Brown Creeper found by Renee. Waterfowl were scarce, aside from the ubiquitous and loud resident Canada Geese, we saw only singles of Pied-billed Grebe and Double-crested Cormorant. Ducks were limited to Mallards and seven Bufflehead.
