



Field of View




Objective Lens Size




Measured in Millimeters



Scope Considerations

- A later purchase ... maybe
- Scopes have very specialized uses and limitations
 - Ideal for long-distance viewing, i.e. shorebirds
 - But cumbersome and not nimble for following moving subjects
- Generally quite expensive
- A stable, sturdy tripod and head is essential
- Ask to look through the scopes of other birders on field trips to evaluate whether one is right for you
 - Don't worry birders are always generous about letting you look through their scopes
 - They'll do the fine tuning of locating the subject and focusing too!

- Key Recommendations for choosing a set of binoculars:
 - <u>Decide</u> your <u>budget</u> <u>Stretch</u>, it's likely a long term purchase.
 - <u>Familiarize</u> yourself with <u>specifications and features</u> that are listed for each binocular you consider.
 - Test, touch, and feel as many different models as possible.
- Key Recommendation for scopes: Wait until later
