Any species observed that is not listed below should be added at the end of the list along with a description including field marks seen, behavior, length of the observation and lighting conditions. For tally purposes, if you see 10 White-throated Sparrows at 9:00 a.m., three at 10:30 a.m. and 16 at 5:00 p.m., the total you would list would be 16, *not* 29 (i.e., the greatest number of a species seen at one time). *Be particularly careful of House Finch and Purple Finch counts.* House Finches are year-round residents often visiting feeders in large flocks. Purple Finches are erratic winter visitors *only* which in some years do not appear at all. Fish and American Crows are separable by voice only. If you hear any, list specific species, otherwise they should be tabulated under *crow species*.
